

Meeting with H.E K. Candra Negara

The Excellency K. Candra Negara Indonesian Consul General in Dubai during the interview with Dr. S.M. Tahir the Chief Editor of Travel n shop magazine, highlighted the major areas of interests from the Indonesian Government point of view The Excellency mainly talked about the Tourism sector in Indonesia & Imports & Exports by Indonesia.

H.E Candra, mentioned that Natural resources in Indonesia include crude oil, natural gas, tin, copper and gold. Machinery and equipment, chemicals, fuels, and foodstuffs are among the most important imports. Oil and gas, electrical appliances, plywood, rubber and textiles are also major exports.

H.E also stated "Tourism has boomed in Indonesia in recent years and is one of the main sources of foreign currency earnings. In 2017, contribution of tourism to GDP amounted to IDR 536.8 trillion, 4.1% of Indonesia's total GDP. In the same year, tourism provided 12.7 million jobs, representing 10.5% of total employment."







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KELIMUTU - THE BOILING LAKE

Kelimutu is a volcano, close to the small town of Moni in central Flores island in Indonesia. It is around 50 km to the east of Ende, Indonesia, the capital of Ende regency in East Nusa Tenggara province. It has three volcanic crater lakes that differ in color i.e Red, Blue and White.

In recent years, tourism has exploded in Indonesia, and it is now one of the country's primary sources of foreign currency profits. Tourism contributed IDR 536.8 trillion to Indonesia's GDP in 2017, accounting for 4.1 percent of the country's total GDP. Tourism provided 12.7 million jobs in the same year, accounting for 10.5 percent of overall employment. The tourism sector outperformed the Indonesian economy's overall expansion, bringing in IDR 200 billion.

Bali is the westernmost of the Lesser Sunda Islands and an Indonesian province. Traditional and modern dance, sculpture, painting, leather, metalworking, and music are among the highly developed arts. Every year in Bali, the Indonesian International Film Festival takes place. Other international events conducted in Bali include the Miss World 2013 pageant and the International Monetary Fund and World Bank Group Annual Meetings in 2018. Bali was named the world's top destination in TripAdvisor's Traveler's Choice award in March 2017, and again in January 2021.

From this vantage point, the massive cliff that takes up the majority of Kelingking Beach resembles a Tyrannosaurus Rex or T-Rex with its jaws open.

How to Get There

Garuda Indonesia now flies from Jakarta to Ternate, with a stopover in Manado. The island is served by the Babullah Airport, which offers a variety of flights. The North Maluku shipping hub is at Ternate, and the PELNI liners dock at Ahmad Yani port if you want to travel by boat.

Jetties can also be found at Bastiong. These ferries connect Ternate to Tidore (Rum). Overnight ferries are also available to Bitung.

You can see the reflective stones shine at you in some parts, hence, the name "Goa Batu Cermin." It translates to "stone mirror cave."

The Raja Ampat



The Raja Ampat Islands are an Indonesian archipelago off the northwest tip of Bird's Head Peninsula in West Papua. Comprising hundreds of jungle-covered islands, Raja Ampat is known for its beaches and coral reefs rich with marine life. Ancient rock paintings and caves are on Misool Island, while the crimson bird of paradise lives on Waigeo Island. Batanta and Salawati are the archipelago's other main islands

The sparsely populated Raja Ampat Islands comprise more than 1500 islands just off Sorong. With their sublime scenery of steep, jungle-covered islands, fine white-sand beaches, hidden lagoons, spooky caves, weird mushroom-shaped islets and pellucid turquoise waters, Raja Ampat is without question one of the most beautiful island chains in the world.


IThe Netherlands is the largest flower producing country in the world with about 68% contribution of the annual flower production. The Netherlands is known as the country of world's beautiful flowers. It is world famous for its wide fields of tulips with wonderful colors. Around 2 billion of these tulips are exported to many countries worldwide. The United Arab Emirates could soon be known for its roses. Since last February, three million roses have been exported from Advanced Horticulture 's farm - just outside Al Hayer, which is about halfway between Dubai and Al Ain - to Holland

The United Arab Emirates prefer to import Dutch flowers because the Netherlands is the main hub for international flora trade. The Netherlands import flowers from different countries (Ecuador, Ethiopia, Kenya, and others). This is why some Dutch flower exporters can sell any flower available and this attracts foreign flower wholesalers and flower shop.

Flowers are one of the main export products in the Netherlands and especially tulips and roses. The most important countries who import Dutch flowers and plants are Germany, the United Kingdom, France, Italy and Russia. But also a lot of other countries in the world import their flowers from Holland

Netherlands, the land of flowers



The Netherlands floriculture market is projected to register a CAGR of 4.7% during the forecast period (2021-2026). Floriculture is one of the lucrative industry in Netherlands. Spring is usually the busiest time of year at the Aalsmeer Flower Auction in the Netherlands, the world#39;s blossom trade capital. For the Netherlands, flowers are a major industry. Roughly 60% of the country is devoted to agriculture or horticulture, and the multi-billion-euro flower industry accounts for 10% of its Gross Domestic Product. The flower market in the Netherlands is a dynamic, fast-growing global industry, defined by three major components, growers, wholesalers, and retailers.

The United Arab Emirates prefer to import Dutch flowers because the Netherlands is the main hub for international floral trade. The Netherlands import flowers from different countries (Ecuador, Ethiopia, Kenya, and others). This is why some Dutch flower exporters can sell any flower available and this attracts foreign flower wholesalers and flower shop.

In most cases, the flowers will be sold at the FloraHolland auctions in Aalsmeer, Naaldwijk and Rijnsburg. Aalsmeer is world's biggest floral auction. Flower export companies will transport the flowers by truck or airplane. To make sure flowers will reach the client in a perfect condition, flowers must be transported under special circumstances. The total revenue of Royal FloraHolland was roughly 4.65 billion euros in 2020. Examining the revenue of cut flower sales by type of Royal FloraHolland, roses were the leading cut flower in 2020 with a sales value of 634 million euros.

Why the Netherlands is the perfect country for tulip growing? The soil in the polders is continuously drained, creating perfect growing conditions for tulip bulbs, which love well drained but moist soil

However, The COVID-19 pandemic has plunged the world's largest flower auction on the outskirts of Amsterdam into chaos. The cut flower sales volume in the auction has been decreased to 595, 064 thousands and 557,436 thousands in March, and April 2020 respectively than 762,513 thousands and 695,516 thousands in 2019 of the same period respectively.

In 2019, the Netherlands export accounted for 47.9% of the global exports in the cut flower segment and ranked 1st in the same year. In 2020, the Netherlands exported 551,098 metric ton of cut flowers valued at USD 4,260,31 thousand. Thus, the increased demand for cut flowers globally is driving the export market in the Netherlands.

There is a huge potential for export of floriculture products and is long term driving force, given it adopts improved production technologies. Therefore, the attractive growth in export market is anticipated to influence the significant market growth over the forecast period.





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




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



In 2002, 11 of the most southerly islands came under the protection of the Ouirimbas National Park, set up to protect the region's magnificent wildlife. To see the region at its most beautiful you'll have to go underwater, where thriving reefs provide the opportunity to dive or snorkel with Napoleon wrasse, dolphins, whitetip reef sharks and a myriad of colorful tropical fish species. Ibo Island also holds some cultural interest, thanks to a series of ruins that date back to the country's Portuguese colonial past; while restaurants across the archipelago specialize in local cuisine.

The Quirimbas Islands lie in the Indian Ocean off northeastern Mozambique, close to Pemba, the capital of the province of Cabo Delgado. The archipelago consists of about 32 islands, including Ibo, Matemo, Medjumbe, Quirimba, Metundo, Quisiva, Vamizi Island and Rolas Island all going up to the Tanzanian border.





ANSE SOURCE D'ARGENT, SEYCHELLES

The Seychelles archipelago has long been one of the world's most romantic destinations and its beaches feature frequently in global Top 10 lists. One of the island nation's most famous beaches is Anse Source D'Argent, located on the island of La Digue. 


Curralinho Beach, Cape Verde
